

# BE A BEHAVIOR DETECTIVE- BEHAVIOR IS ALWAYS COMMUNICATION

## ALWAYS ASK WHY?



Ask the child? Ask yourselves- what is happening before, during and after. Is it age expected?

\*When asking a teen or defensive tween instead of using the word "why" try "tell me more about that..."

## WATCH

Some kids need more structure! Are the expectations clear?



## NEVER TAKE BEHAVIOR PERSONALLY



Is the child missing social cues?  
\* Remember rudeness may really be impulsiveness.

## CHECK YOURSELF!

Are your directions misunderstood or missed entirely?



## REMEMBER



The definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over again, but expecting different results. Keep trying to reach kids in different ways.
